The four winners this year were Allison Lang, a Fenwick High School graduate; Michael Liszka, an IC Catholic Prep graduate; Rachel Stoll, a Timothy Christian High School graduate; and Eileen King, a York Community High School graduate.

Lang plans to major in nursing at St. Louis University with a long-term goal of becoming a nurse practitioner and joining the Peace Corps,

Wagner died in 1993 at the age of 16 after dedicating much of his life to assisting his peers and neighbors, the release stated.
