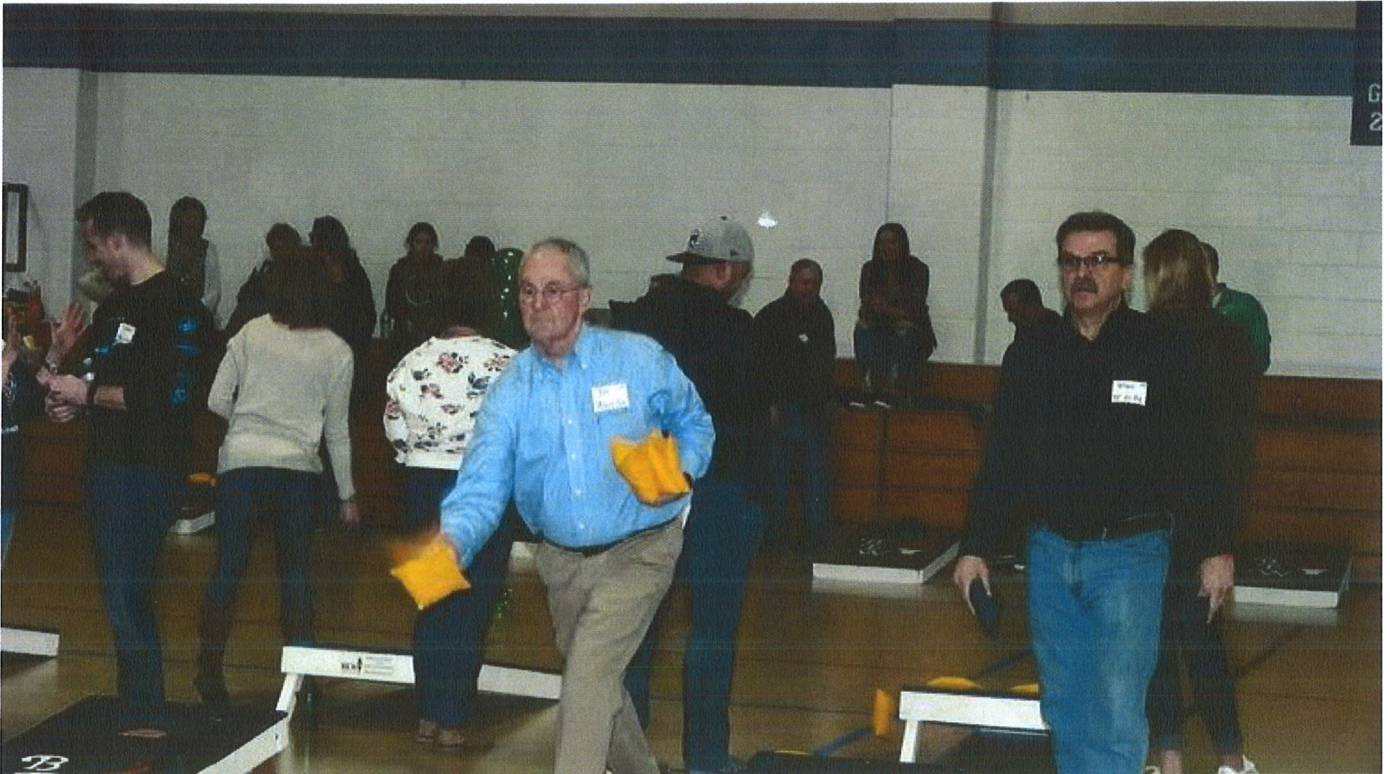


From the community: Brian E. Wagner Scholarship Proudly Gives Back to the Elmhurst Community
